The VIR searches for information in the Alberta Motor Vehicles and Personal Property databases. It does not search for information in the other jurisdictions.

The information reported on the VIR is valid only at the date and time shown on the report. A VIR should be purchased as close as possible to the date the vehicle is purchased.

Is the description of the vehicle correct? If not, ensure the serial number (VIN) is correct.

The last three odometer readings, the date they were recorded and possibly a reason code could be displayed.

If the vehicle does not have a continuous registration history in Alberta it may indicate it was registered in another province/state or stored for a period of time. Ask the seller to explain the time lapse.

The VIR reports the number of liens registered in Alberta. Liens registered in other provinces will not be reported. If a vehicle appears to have been registered in another province, it may be possible that a lien is registered against the vehicle in that province. An out of province lien search may be necessary.

Be aware, a lien may be registered between the time the report was printed and your purchase of the vehicle. Request the VIR as close as possible to the date the vehicle is purchased.

Is the serial number (VIN) correct? If the vehicle description on the VIR does not match the vehicle you are purchasing the serial number may be incorrect. A visual inspection of the serial number may be required.

Is the colour the same? If not, you may want to ask the seller about the change.

If the status of the vehicle is not "ACTIVE", a safety inspection may be necessary to register the vehicle.

This is the date the vehicle was first registered in Alberta.

The VIR identifies liens for a vehicle that match the VIN exactly. One incorrect character could result in incorrect information. Ensure the VIN is correct.
